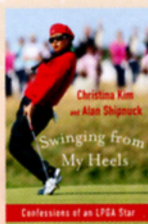


## Eight of Golf's Greatest Books (continued)

**Plugged** by Krissi Barr and Dan Barr (*Clerisy Press, 2010*)

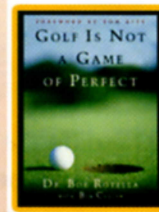
Billed as a modern-day fable, *Plugged* utilizes golf as a backdrop to teach readers to Prioritize, Adapt and Be Responsible.

Known as one of the greatest ball strikers ever, in 1957 golf great Ben Hogan wrote what is to this day still one of the best-selling and most influential golf instructional manuals in the history of golf. This illustrated guide takes you inside Hogan's inner secrets to the grip, address, backswing, forward swing and more.



**The Unplayable Lie: The Untold Story of Women and Discrimination in America** by Marcia Chambers (*Pocket Books, 1995*)

Former Yale Law School advisor Marcia Chambers, a lifelong journalist who wrote for the Associated Press, *New York Times*, and the *National Law Journal*, authored this controversial book to shine a light on continuing discrimination against women at clubs. The book details how the PGA Tour, PGA of America and USGA fostered discrimination against women by holding tournaments at clubs which discriminate. But haven't things changed since 1995?
